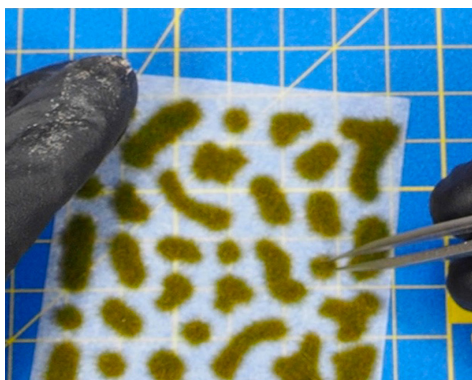
## Grass spots and brushes in concrete pavement joints

The addition of small details makes our groundworks more interesting and realistic. This step by step will show you how to replicate bushes and small grass spots growing up in pavement joints, using different Vallejo Scenery products.

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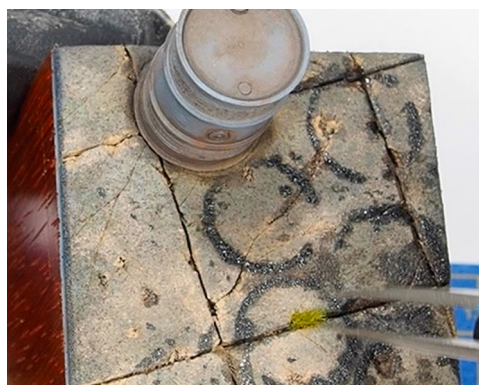
1 View of the groundwork prior the application of grass.



2 Vallejo Scenery SC401 Wild Tuft - Dry Green is used to replicate the small bushes. The product comes in different shapes and sizes to choose the ones more adequate for each project.



3 The small bush is cut into strips to fit the pavement joints.



4 Bushes are placed with the help of tweezers. The product is self-adhesive, so the use of glue is not needed.



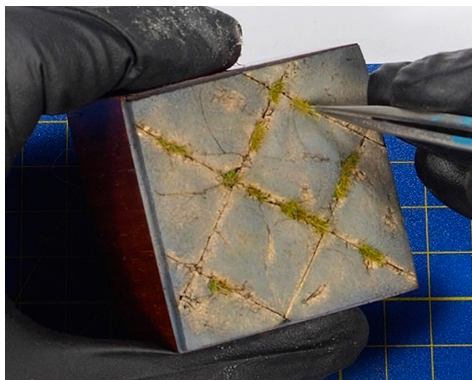
5 As many spots as needed are placed to get the desired effect.



6 Vallejo Scenery SC409 Wild Tuft - Autumn was used to add different lengths and color spots. Spots are placed randomly to get a pleasant and realistic effect.
