How to use

Metal Color painting figures

Metal Color is a waterbased metallic color range, especially designed for airbrush techniques. The range also includes a Gloss Black Acrylic Polyurethane Surface Primer and a Gloss Varnish Water Based Metal Varnish.

1 Some plastic parts from a gladiator figure are prepared for painting with Metal Colors.



2 The approach is always the same. The parts are airbrushed with Gloss Black 77.660 Surface Primer.



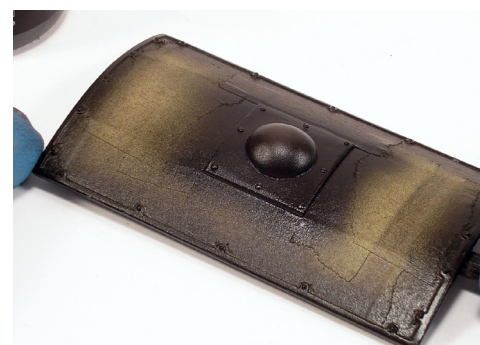
3 Once the parts are well dry, the sword was airbrushed with Steel 77.712 and highlighted with Aluminium 77.701.



4 The helmet was airbrushed with Copper 77.710.



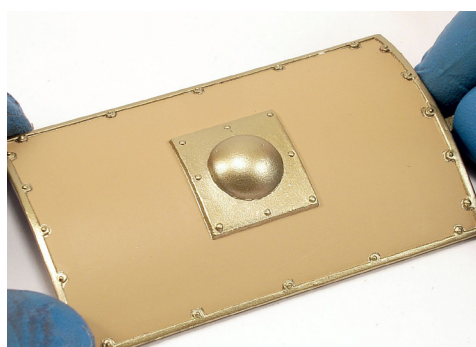
5 Small details can also be applied by brush. In this case small details are brush painted with Gold 77.725.



6 The shield was masked and the metal parts airbrushed with Gloss Black 77.660 Surface Primer.



7 Once Gloss Black 77.660 is well dry, the desired parts were airbrushed with Gold 77.725.



8 Once the paint has dried, the masking tape was removed. Now the shield is ready for the weathering final steps.



9 The Metal Color range looks amazing and the colors are very vivid. They can be easily and safely weathered in acrylics or enamels. The final results are stunning.
