"Never," the other man replied at once. "Your order was... unexpected. But it shall be done."

"See it so," Legulus nodded, and the other man retreated. What seemed like a lifetime ago, after the Cult of Ruhmal had enacted their ritual binding his allegiance to their dark goddess, Legulus had assisted in the devastation of the Ivory Kingdoms. He had seen the many terrible beasts the cult had locked away with wards and rituals, intending to use them later as weapons. Now they would all be freed, and the Rokugani would suffer for their temerity. Legulus may not have chosen to serve Kali-Ma of his own free will, but that did not lessen his rage over her death. So few men were privileged to serve a goddess, and the Rokugani had taken that away from him.

With the beasts and demons freed, the Colonies would be in turmoil. And if the Colonies were in turmoil, then Legulus would have greater freedom to strike. He would teach the samurai what it meant to know fear. He would kill a Clan Champion. The first of many.

Given the revelations that we have experienced since that time, we can only assume that the machinations of P'an Ku were somehow involved, not to mention the interference from the Fudo cult. "The Crane," Hiromi said pointedly. "What about the Crane?"

"There have been no further engagements since the battle," Kanahashi said. "Like us, they lost too many men. They are hesitant to draw the conflict out any further. I believe we could come to an equitable agreement, if you wish to see the conflict ended."

"I do wish to see it ended, but not with mewling in court. That is how the Crane wish it. The Mantis will not accommodate them."

- New Rules and Notes on Specific Cards -

In Ivory Edition, events will work differently, and the Events in Gates of Chaos and the previous expansion, Colls of Madness, are worded that way. Until the next base set becomes legal, all Events in these two expansions do not have the Limited: designator; the text is a trait with normal resolution effects.

Additionally, in order to work properly under Emperor Edition rules, the Event, A Fever in the Blood has a temporary technical Most Recent Printing to read: Put this Eyent into play, Discard it after your next turn begins. While it is in play, Personalities and Followers have –1F while attacking. The card's official text will revert to its printed text with the legality of the next base set.

In the coming Edition, all cards with a Gold cost will enter play using actions, and the Gold cost will always be paid using a variable cost () of the action, that looks to the card's Gold Cost stat. Until the next base set becomes legal, for cards printed with or after Coils of Madness, ignore the variable Gold cost icon on any action that brings a non-created card into play using the terms "equip" or "recruit".

Recruit: The card Yoritomo Mikaru in Gates of Chaos uses the term "recruit"

which refers to bringing a Dynasty card into play. This is tied to the change in rules referred to above.

New Rules

Destined: The meaning of this new keyword is simple. After your Destined card enters play, draw a Fate card. The draw is not optional.

Fortifications: Veteran players may remember the Fortification type of Holdings from early editions of the game. Now, the Fortification keyword is back, and it works much the same as it used to.

When brought into play, Fortification Holdings are attached to the Province they entered play from, or to any of your Provinces if they were not brought in from a Province. Fortifications enter play paying costs as normal, but enter play unbowed (straightened). They are still located in your home, but are discarded if the Province is destroyed; this discarding will not be prevented.

Invest : This is a new special trait containing a Gold icon. The icon and colon do not mean that the trait itself has a cost, but describe the amount of an additional cost that can optionally be paid after

bringing the card into play. The additional cost must be paid separately from the cost of playing the card, and only once each time the card enters play.

If you pay the extra cost, apply the effect described in the Invest trait.

Cards that produce Gold for special purposes treat the Invest cost as a cost of the card itself. For example, a card that only produces Gold to pay for a Follower will produce Gold for a Follower's additional Invest cost as well. However, cost reductions do not apply to Invest unless they specifically mention it (as Daigotsu Kikumura's first trait does, for example).

Notes on Specific Cards

The Lost Colossus: Players other than its controller may target the Colossus with Political actions.

Ikoma Ayumu: Until the legality date of the next base set, Ikoma Ayumu's trait reads: "The rulebook Tactical Advantage is an Open action for you if you choose Ayumu to perform it." This makes the card work properly under Emperor Edition rules.
